

Exeter WW1 Hospitals Map

- 1 **Hospital No 1**
The West of England Eye Infirmary, lent by the hospital governors, opened in 1914.
Now Hotel du Vin
- 2 **Hospital No 2**
The Episcopal Modern School for Girls, lent by the City Council, opened in 1914.
Now Bishop Blackall School
- 3 **Hospital No 3**
The new Children's Home at the Workhouse, lent by the Exeter Board of Guardians, opened in 1914. Now being redeveloped as flats
- 4 **Hospital No 4**
A building at Topham Barracks once a hospital but more recently a store, opened in 1915. Now Wyven Barracks
- 5 **Hospital No 5**
The Women Students' Hostel at Bradinch House, lent by the City Council, and the Congregational School Rooms next door, lent by the Church, opened in 1915
- 6 **Hospital No 6**
The Bishop's Palace, lent by the Bishop of Exeter, opened in 1917. Now the Cathedral Library and Bishop's Palace
- 7 **Hospital No 7**
Streatham Hall, Cowley Bridge Road (now Reed Hall at the University), lent by the Thornton West family, opened in 1917. Now Reed Hall, University of Exeter
- 8 **Hospital No 8**
Mess and recreation hall, formerly the Territorial Drill Hall, Bedford Circus, demolished after the Second World War. Patients of Hospital No 8 were billeted around the city particularly in the Southernhay area and used this as their day centre
- 9 **Red Cross Divisional Headquarters**
9-10 Southernhay East
- 10 **Queen Street Station**
Now Exeter Central Station
- 11 **Dean Clarke House**
In 1914 the Royal Devon and Exeter Hospital where many of the doctors at the War Hospitals also worked
- 12 **34 Southernhay West**
Used by the Red Cross as a hostel for nursing sisters
